



PLEASE PRINT AND POST FOR SHORT TERM RENTAL GUESTS

Short-Term Rental Owners and Managers:

As the 4th of July approaches, the Oceanside Fire Department's Community Risk Reduction Division wants to provide all short-term rental property owners and managers with the information needed to educate their guests about the City of Oceanside laws regarding the use of fireworks. Many guests will be coming from out of town or out of state and may be unaware of the firework laws within our jurisdiction.

All consumer fireworks are illegal in the City of Oceanside and the County of San Diego. This includes sparklers, firecrackers, cherry bombs, roman candles, bottle rockets and even poppers (California Health & Safety Code Sections 12500-12726, OCC SEC. 11.25).

Please remember the following information:

The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to observe a public display conducted by trained professionals.

Please make sure to educate your guests about the laws within our city so that we can have a safe and enjoyable 4th of July celebration. Additionally, a Short-Term Rental permit may be modified, suspended, or revoked for documented violation(s) of the Ordinance. Any Short-Term Rental that has been the subject of three verified complaints will be automatically referred to the City Attorney's Office for enforcement of appropriate remedies (Good Neighbor Policy, 1/16/20). A single, egregious violation can also result in permit removal.
